### *Increasing Student Success*

Community college open enrollment policies enable students of varying levels of academic preparedness the opportunity to work toward achieving their goals. Students attend community colleges with diverse goals - including certificate and degree completion, attainment of specific skills for employment opportunities, personal enrichment, and more.

Ohio's community colleges are focused on increasing the number of students who reach their personal academic goals through initiatives such as the success point component of the new community college funding formula and participation in the national "Achieving the Dream" initiative aimed at using data to examine student success rates more individually and move beyond a "one size fits all" approach to serving their diverse learning needs and improving outcomes.

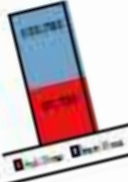

## Ohio's Community Colleges

### Tuition and Financial Aid

Average annual FY 2008 tuition and fees (adjusted price for inflation, using relative student tuition status) was \$2,296. The cost to attend Ohio's Community Colleges varies based on the individual circumstances of students and may be reduced through grants and scholarships.

Financial Aid Awarded to Students

**Overall Financial Aid**  
 + 70% of Ohio's students, representing students in 2008-09 received financial aid of some type including need-based grants and loans, merit-based, and non-restricted scholarships.

**Federal Financial Aid**  
 + 57% of Ohio's students, representing students in 2008-09 received a federal grant. The average grant for the year was \$2,275.

**State Financial Aid**  
 + 20% of Ohio's students, representing students in 2008-09 received a state grant. The average grant for the year was \$1,484.

**Private Financial Aid**  
 + 9% of Ohio's students, representing students in 2008-09 received a private grant. The average grant for the year was \$1,361.
