KEEPING IT ALL IN CONTEXT---A FIRE SCIENCE AND ENGLISH
PILOT PROJECT

A Brief History...

1) Over the last four Autumns, we have enrolled an average of 15 Fire Science students in each English 0054 class, a developmental class that focuses on reading and essay writing skills.

2) Using the Fire Science text and other high interest materials, students learn vocabulary, improve communication skills, and write their first English class essays.

Results...

1) Not counting those who stopped attending, withdrew, or were no-shows, our English 0054 student retention rates have averaged 92%.

2) When we do count those who stopped attending, withdrew, or were no-shows, our English 0054 student retention rates have averaged 68%.

Challenges...

- 1) Contextualized instruction requires commitment, collaboration, and a willingness to continue to work together in partnership.
- 2) Contextualized instruction requires increased class preparation time and planning, especially in the beginning.
- 3) Although consistent class attendance in both classes has improved dramatically, the students who fail are still those who do not attend class regularly.
