CONCURRENT SESSIONS – LEADERSHIP ACADEMY FOR STUDENT SUCCESS PATHWAYS PROJECT PANEL

An essential component of the OACC Leadership Academy has been to help the Student Success Fellows apply the skills and competencies they learned throughout the year-long program to real-life scenarios. Fellows were assigned to a team of 3 or 4 people to work on a "Pathways Project" for the duration of the Leadership Academy. Each of the Pathways Projects focused on one of the four pillars of the Guided Pathways framework (i.e. Clarify the paths, help students get on a path, help students stay on their path, and ensure students are learning). Teams refined their project over the past year and produced a final implementation memorandum that articulated their plans. This session features four concurrent discussions panels (one for each of the Guided Pathways Pillars) that will each highlight three Pathway Projects.

SESSION A: LEADING CULTURE CHANGE THROUGH A SYSTEMATIC APPROACH TO ADDRESSING POVERTY BARRIERS

Amarillo College (AC) transformed our institution when it created a systemic approach to addressing poverty barriers for students. Through our Culture of Caring approaches, we connect students to on-campus programs, services and projects designed to support students, boost graduation and transfer, and increase student persistence. AC's Advocacy and Resource Center is the hub of our social services initiative. Growing from serving less than 1.5% of our student enrollment in 2012, the ARC assists 32% of our total student enrollment today. Yet even with this remarkable growth, AC continues to revolutionize our institution by using data analytics and technology to drive social services connections before students even begin classes. By closing the loop before it can open, AC is ensuring students can and will achieve academic success.



SESSION B: REFORMING ACADEMIC SYSTEMS WITH AN 8-WEEK MODEL

Amarillo College (AC) recognizes the needs of our first-generation students and worked across the institution to create systems embracing and supporting their needs. By working together, AC faculty and staff found solutions to meet our students where they were and help them achieve their educational goals. In spring 2016, AC piloted 8-weeks courses for a select number of courses. Based on the success, AC used data analytics to determine that approximately 77% of our enrollment was centered around 26 courses. By transitioning these classes to an accelerated format, students are completing their degrees on time. At AC we know the longer "Maria" takes to complete her degree, the costlier it becomes and the less likely she is to graduate. By creating an intentional system to graduate every student in three years, AC innovatively accelerates Maria's learning and her education attainment.
