








First Time Freshmen in Ohio








High School Graduates to Decline Nationwide














Adult Enrollment Continues Declines Since Great Recession

*Increases in adult learners enrolled in Ohio's public Institutions of Higher Education since 2018 are largely due to the introduction of online program partnerships that enroll a significant number of out-of-state students. These students are unlikely to represent a part of Ohio's economy.

Students of color saw the greatest percent increase in completion of gateway courses from the 2009 baseline year. Black student completion of gateway mathematics and English courses increased from 22% to 40% (an 82% increase) and Hispanic student completion rose from 35% to 48% (a 37% gain).



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






Ohio Revised Code - 3345.81 Strategic Completion Plan

"Not later than June 30, 2014, the board of trustees of each institution of higher education, as defined by section 3345.12 of the Revised Code, shall adopt an institution-specific strategic completion plan designed to increase the number of degrees and certificates awarded to students. The plan shall be consistent with the mission and strategic priorities of the institution, include measurable student completion goals, and align with the state's workforce development priorities. Upon adoption by the board of trustees, each institution of higher education shall provide a copy of its plan to the chancellor of higher education.

The board of trustees of each institution of higher education shall update its plan at least once every two years and provide a copy of their updated plan to the chancellor upon adoption."













Updates to Completion Plans

Part 1: Progress toward student completion goals established in 2020-2022 Completion Plan

Part 2: Updated student completion goals, with metrics, for the two year period between July 1, 2022 and June 30th, 2024













Priority 1: Ensuring All Students are On-Track to be Successful within their First Year

- Metrics to consider:
 - Increasing the percentage of new degree seeking students completing gateway mathematics and English courses within their first twelve months of study
 - reducing the number of students in and sections of stand-alone developmental education courses













Priority 2: Reducing Equity Gaps in Retention & Degree Attainment for Traditionally Disadvantaged Populations

- Metrics to consider:
 - Retention and completion disaggregated by race/ethnicity, gender, SES, age, first-generation status, etc.













Priority 3:

Increasing Enrollment of and Number of Degrees and Credentials Awarded to Adult Learners

- Metrics to consider:
 - Credit for Prior Learning awarded
 - Number of adults students engaged through targeted outreach programs (e.g.: Second Chance Grant, College Comeback)













Priority 4: Alignment to the State's Workforce Development Priorities

- Metrics to consider:
 - Increasing opportunities to earn credentials of value leading to gainful employment and/or increased wages
 - Increasing the number of students earning degrees directly leading to employment that aligns with the state's workforce development priorities













Data and Template

- Data sources and template remain unchanged from 2020.
 - Data is being updated
 - Data and template will be sent to Chief Academic Officers in the beginning of March
 - Use of template is voluntary
 - Template can be altered to best fit your campus
- Completion Plans must be approved by your Board of Trustees before being submitted to the Chancellor – due June 30th 2022.
